

## Comprehensive Plan Amendments for Emergency Preparedness

### Policy Amendments

**CF-1** Develop and regularly update functional plans that assess capital facility needs and strategies for addressing such needs. Provide opportunities for public involvement appropriate to the nature of the update. Use functional plans to guide the development of capital priorities and investment decisions within each of the following functional areas:

- Fire protection and [emergency management](#) response, including the city and Fire District #34;
- Police protection;
- Stormwater and surface water management;
- Water and sewer systems;
- Parks, arts, recreation, culture and conservation;
- [Transportation](#);
- [Emergency preparedness and management](#);
- General government facilities; and
- Other functional areas as identified.

**CF-2.5** [Address applicable emergency preparedness needs as part of functional and strategic plan updates, such as planning for:](#)

- [Seismic retrofits](#);
- [Infrastructure resiliency \(“Safe-to-fail” mechanisms including backup power generation, resilient network infrastructure, and communications; and](#)
- [Methods and facilities \(“Alternative Service Centers”\) to provide essential services including shelter, food and water, medical care, cleanup, and restoration. Locate Alternative Service Centers in areas of the City less susceptible to hazards such as liquefaction, landslides, and floods.](#)
