Subject: **Comprehensive Plan Amendments for Emergency Preparedness and Management**

Introduction

The Planning Commission held their first study session regarding the proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment for Emergency Preparedness and Management on December 7, 2016. Staff introduced the Technical Committee's recommendation and provided background and an overview of the proposed amendments. The Technical Committee's recommendation would amend policy CF-1 and add a new policy CF-2.5 to provide for consideration of applicable emergency preparedness and management needs as part of functional and strategic planning. Commissioners identified one item for further discussion at the December 7 meeting, which is discussed further on the Issue Matrix (attached).
