Project Updates:

Park Planning Updates

- Downtown Park – Team is finalizing 100% plans and bid documents. Plan to bid the project in January. Peat removal contract is complete.
- Redmond Central Connector – Delivery and installation of the new concrete deck panels for the Sammamish River Trestle are expected to begin the week of 10/31. The railing and interpretive panels will follow soon after. The site is nearly ready for paving which is expected in mid-November.

Arts & Culture Updates

- Cups of Tea - Last week, Janet successfully launched 8 Cups of Tea with support from Damion, Ken, Jessica, Maggie, Megan, and Sharon. This was the most successful art exhibit program ever! There were at least 50 people in City hall lobby learning about tea culture and sipping tea in family groups and friend groups in middle of the day. It created a great welcoming experience. Recreation Updates

Homeless Shelter donation

Hartman Park Batting Cage – The finish line is getting closer! Staff have been working very hard on this project. The gravel base has been installed and leveled, perimeter concrete wall poured, fence posts installed, and batting cage netting posts installed.
