Project Updates

Redmond Central Connector Phase II

Construction progress is continuing. In October trestle panel installation will be in progress, trail paving should be underway, and the new fish-passable culvert should be installed. It is possible that the opening of the trail will be delayed until early 2017 as the contract is not progressing as quickly as expected due to weather delays earlier this spring. In addition, since the contractor's budget was favorable, the City is requesting change orders to add back items that were value engineered out of the project to meet budget including the staircase on the west side of the trestle, paving the plug and play seating areas, and adding back the 25% of the landscaping. Constructing these items will add working days to the project.

Downtown Park

Peat removal is underway and on-track to be completed in October.

Staff is planning a field trip to visit the water wall for the pavilion and will share an invite soon.

Final plans are in progress and the project will be advertised for bid in January 2017.

Community & Aquatics Center

Staff and a core group of stakeholders are making progress on branding for the public engagement campaign. The project will be referred to as Redmond's Community Centers: Let's Create the Future Now. The logo is being finalized. The stakeholder group membership is being finalized and meetings scheduled. The launch of the education and awareness campaign should begin in mid-October, including a new website and other collateral.
